In the few days I have been at the school I have been conscious of the many opportunities for leadership embraced by the students. The senior students are busy considering the Student of the Year award and casting their votes. The Year 6 students are 'gearing up' for their turn as school leaders by listening to information about the Student Representative Council Executive and deciding whether to run for election.

#### ***A focus on Learning***

While they are obviously the most important, students are not the only learners in our school community. Staff and parent learning are also highly valued. This year, staff have begun to implement the new national curriculum, beginning with Maths and Science. We thank the Governing Council and parents for their support of staff training days to help us achieve this task.

**Tomorrow, Friday November 2<sup>nd</sup> we have our final staff training day for the year.** The day will be a review of our school priority areas of Maths, English and Science. We will review the success of the strategies we employed and our achievement of the targets we set. Staff teams will examine student achievement data, particularly the NAPLAN results, to determine specific teaching points for future focus. This will inform our site priorities for 2013. In their 'spare time' teachers are working on class placements for 2013 and beginning to write the end of year reports. And then there's the Concert to prepare! I am enjoying being part of such a vibrant school community.

At CLG, a very popular app is PuppetPals. The lite version is free and the HD Director's Pass version costs \$2.99. All Year levels from R-7 enjoy using this one.

Mama Mae and Lee Lee - an immersive storytelling experience that includes exclusive, original music from Alicia Keys. Explore a richly detailed 3D room; listen to music written and performed by Alicia Keys within the Music Box; play your own songs on the virtual piano; answer 365 Daily Challenges in a private journal; draw masterpieces using a wide selection of colors and brushes in the virtual journal; and explore an exciting new world in the adventures of "Blue Moon." ## Chicken Pox / Measles – Assistance requested

As a number of parents may be aware Luke Kennedy, younger brother of Cade and Abby who both attend our school has been diagnosed with Leukaemia. Luke's mother Sarah has been working with a number of our students in her Speech Pathologist capacity as well as volunteering generally. Leukaemia is a cancer of the blood. It is not infectious and can't be passed on to anyone. Unfortunately Luke's condition makes him very vulnerable to infection particularly to chicken pox and measles. The good news is that if we can find out within a couple of days that he has been in contact with someone who has developed chicken pox or measles (or has a family member who has), he can be given a preventative injection to give him some extra protection. We request parents/caregivers contact the school if your school child or an immediate family member develops either of these diseases.
