### **Student Reports and Class Placements**

Because many classes would be unable to participate in transition activities next Friday due to swimming, it has been decided to send home class placement information on **Monday, December 10**<sup>th</sup>. Students coming from other schools have been invited to join transition activities on this day.

End of year summative reports will be sent home with class placement information and we remind parents that we use the Australian Curriculum marking system, where a 'C' achievement level means that the student has achieved year level expectations. Please read the reports carefully, including the key that explains the levels of achievement and effort. When read carefully, using both the ratings and the teacher comments, the reports provide a high level of detail about your child's progress and achievement. If you have questions about the report or require clarification, please feel free to make an appointment to speak to the class teacher.

#### **Important school dates 2013**

Once again the government has allocated extra training days for teachers to implement the new Australian Curriculum. Last year our focus was on the areas of Science and Mathematics. In 2013 we will be focusing on English and History. We have tied many of the staff training pupil free days to long weekends, allowing families who wish to take holidays to minimise student absence from school. Student attendance rates at our school are generally very good, but absences are often of an extended nature and often due to family holidays. ### **Marion Swim Centre Program Rec – Year 5**

Our Swimming Program commences on Monday 3rd December for students in Years R-5. Please ensure you have returned the two required consent forms to your child's classroom teacher. These are essential for students to be able to participate.

While the school pays for all swimming lessons, parents are asked to cover the cost of transport. Please pay the \$10 per student for the bus transport at the Front Office, or give the money to your child's class teacher.

Buses will arrive at the front of the school (on West Parkway) from approx 8:30am Monday morning and shuttle throughout the day and throughout the week. To assist the drivers we ask that you do not park in this area.

A reminder about Sun Safety – hats, sunscreen etc are vital. Please ensure that your child has sunscreen with them so that it can be applied at least 20 minutes prior to the lesson. Sun damage can occur even on overcast days!

### **Reports of Illness**

Gastro – We have recently had a number of children away with Gastro. The incubation period (time between becoming infected and developing symptoms) for gastro is 24-72 hours. The infectious period (time during which an infected person can infect others) is during the illness and for at least 24 hours after symptoms have disappeared. Children should be excluded from child care, preschool, school and work until there has been no diarrhoea or vomiting for 24 hours.
