Staff will be participating in training and development on the Australian Curriculum – English.

We will begin with an overview of the essence of the curriculum - how it is constructed and why it is constructed that way. The curriculum has three interwoven strands of Literacy, Literature and Language. We will then focus in depth on the Language strand and look at Jolly Phonics and Literacy for learning, two detailed language development programs.

# Room 22's History Journey

As part of history, the Year 2's have been looking at the life and work of Colonel William Light. Rooms 22, 23, 24 and 16 have been on a history excursion to try to understand more about Light and his impact on Adelaide. The excursion included visiting Light's burial place at Light Square and sketching what can be seen now from Light's Vision at Montefiore Hill. The children also enjoyed a tour of the Migration Museum, where they learnt more about the hard lives of many early migrants, and observed a portrait of Light in the Art Gallery.
