What is a 'C' or 'Satisfactory'?

Dear parents, carers and community friends,

The year is racing by and in a few short weeks parents will be receiving the end of year written report for their child. The report will look a little different this year because we have implemented the Australian Curriculum in English and History.

In English parents will now see only one grade for achievement and one for effort, rather than the separate grades for reading, writing etc. This is because in the Australian Curriculum language development is taught in a holistic, integrated way rather than as separate strands. We have added a teacher comment for English and Maths to our end of year reports to enable teachers to provide detail about areas of strength or concern within these curricula.

Parents will also note that many of their child's achievement grades may be listed as 'satisfactory', which equates to a 'C'. This is a good result! It means that your child has achieved the year level expectations for that subject. Satisfactory achievement means that your child has a sound understanding of concepts and key ideas, sound skill development and an adequate knowledge of content. They can apply knowledge and skills in new contexts. A 'satisfactory' result is no cause for concern.

When you receive your child's written report we encourage you to take the time to look carefully at both the achievement level and the effort rating for each subject. It's not surprising that when read together these two scores give a fuller picture. Then read the teacher comment in light of the achievement level, including the general comment.

After a mid-term report, a three way conference and student led conference the end of year report will contain no surprises. However, if there is anything that is not clear, please seek clarification from the class teacher.

School Dental Service

Dental care for your children is important for children to have strong, healthy teeth and gums. All children (0 – 17 years) are welcome to attend **School Dental Service** clinics. Dental treatment is free at **School Dental Service** clinics if:

- Family Tax Benefit Part A is paid for your child, or
- Your child is covered by a School Card, Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card.

The **School Dental Service** will bulk-bill under the new Medicare *Child Dental Benefits Schedule* that starts in 2014. Under this scheme, most children aged between 2-17 years will be eligible to claim up to \$1000 of Dental services over 2 years. If your child already attends a SA Dental Service clinic, contact us when their next appointment is due. If your child does not already attend one of our clinics, please phone us to make an appointment in 2014.
