Instalment Plans

COMMUNICATION 2015

Our school uses digital technology extensively to communicate with our community. The newsletters are posted to the school blog and parents receive an email alert, providing of course that they have subscribed! Subscriptions to the blog only need to be done once, not annually. However, if you require a hard copy of the newsletter we ask you to let us know *every year*. If you would like a hard copy of the newsletter, please pop into the Front Office and fill out a form to be added to the list.

Newsletters for Term 1 will be in odd weeks then for Terms 2 – 4 will be sent out on even weeks. Due dates for items in the newsletter is 12 noon on Tuesdays of the week it is due out. Next newsletter's deadline is Tuesday 11th February.

Every class also has a blog and teachers will be using this regularly to communicate to parents. They also set up email groups.

We ask parents to please open and read the communications.

ASSEMBLIES

Would you like to attend an Assembly? Our school has two types of Assemblies. The whole-school assembly is held a couple of times per term and is for students and staff. We don't invite parents because you wouldn't fit in the Langley Hall!

However, we often hold R-2 and Year 3-7 assemblies that are run by classes and include performances and awards. Parents are warmly invited to attend. The first such Assembly is in week 2 on Friday 6th February. The R-2 assembly will be from 11:30am- 12noon, hosted by Room 24 and the Year 3-7 assembly will be from 12:20pm – 12:50pm, hosted by Room 1.

IMPORTANT DATES FOR 2015

The government has allocated pupil-free training days for teachers to implement the new Australian Curriculum. This year the staff training pupil free days are determined by the availability of speakers, some of whom we have booked two years in advance! Acquaintance Night will be held on **Tuesday**, **February 10th**, **2015**. This is a time for you to come to school, to meet your child's teacher and to develop an understanding of the class activities and programs planned for the year.

The R - 1 classrooms are open from 6.00 - 6.45pm and your child will have a series of tasks to complete with you to provide you with a really good understanding of their classroom and specialist programs. You can chat with the teacher and ask any general questions. Please note there is no general meeting between sessions.

Year 2 to 7 classrooms are open from 7:00 to 7:45pm. Teachers will provide information to parents about the classroom environment they have created and the goals that their class is working towards in 2014. This will include such topics as:

- classroom expectations
- communication methods to be used
- homework expectations
- planned activities for the year

- curriculum topics to be covered
- outline of weekly timetable
- how parents may be of assistance

We hope to see a member of every family here for this introduction. Each teacher will send information home about the format of their Acquaintance Night and exactly what time they will be talking.

KEEPING VULNERABLE STUDENTS SAFE

Every child in our school is unique, but some have extra challenges to face - especially those with special medical requirements.

This year we have some students with Leukaemia and auto-immune disorders across the Year 1-7 year levels. They are all very vulnerable to childhood diseases such as measles, chickenpox, and gastroenteritis – and they have brothers and sisters attending in other year levels! This means *everyone* needs to be supportive and vigilant.

We also have many students with an asthma plan and others with anaphylactic reactions to nuts, eggs and other common foods.

We all need to be conscious of good community health practices.

To include all these children safely in our school community we need to take extra care:

- Please notify the school if your child contracts diseases such as measles, chickenpox, etc.
- Please keep your child home for 24 hours after last episode of vomiting/diarrhoea, i.e., if your child is unwell repeatedly during the night but not in the morning, it is still not appropriate to send them to school that day.
- Please do not send lunches that contain nuts including nutella, peanut paste and whole nuts.
- Train your children not to share food.
- If you wish to send in any food, such as a cake or treat for your child's birthday, please notify the class teacher several days beforehand so they have time to give other parents at least two day notice to provide an alternative.

FUNDRAISING

Anyone interested in helping out with Fundraising this year is warmly invited to the first meeting of the year next **Wednesday**, **February 4th at 9:00am** in the staffroom. Drop your children at school and then join us for a cuppa to plan the events for the year.

In 2015 we really want to have a Quiz night, which was sorely missed by our parents last year. We need help to get this organised.

CONSENT FORMS

This week you will have received 3 consent forms from your child. A **general consent form** is a general consent form for yard supervision, borrowing library books, SWW, and for medications.

The **blue consent form** is for permission to be photographed in school, class blog, newsletter and website. During the course of the year, students' likenesses, images (still or video), voice and creative work may be uploaded to the internet via the school newsletter or through a class blog or other websites such as Youtube, iTunes, etc. A blog is an interactive website that many teachers use for communicating with parents and to showcase students' learning. The three permissions on the blue form are specifically for photographs and video of your child and allow us to easily collate permissions for teacher and administration purposes. The form on the reverse of this page gives permission for images *and* creative works eg stories, animations, powerpoints, songs, poetry etc, to be uploaded to the internet.

If you wish to allow creative works but not images to be published please amend the form as indicated. Please contact Louisa Guest at Louisa.Guest741@schools.sa.edu.au or by phone on 8276 1523 if you have any questions regarding these permissions.

The **white form** is an ICT user agreement. Information and Communications Technologies (ICT) are electronic devices and /or applications which allow users to record, send, access or receive information in textual, audio, image or video form. To promote the safe and responsible use of ICT, Colonel Light Gardens Primary School has developed guidelines on acceptable and non acceptable uses for students.

Please return all three forms promptly to your child's class teacher.

STUDENT DATA INFORMATION

This week you will have received a printed copy of the information about your child that we currently have on the school database. This information includes medical and custody information, emergency contacts as well as other vital information pertaining to your child. If you have changed phone numbers, mobile numbers, address or need to update your emergency contacts, please change the details on the form, sign it and return to your child's teacher by Friday 7th February.

MEDICATIONS

If your child is taking any kind of medication and it is kept in the office, could you please come in and check that the dates and directions are accurate. We are unable to administer out of date medications. You will also need to fill in the permission form for 2015. Please collect any medication that is no longer required for your child.

AFTER HOURS SPORT

We had an excellent turn out of parents and students to the School Sports registration evening on Wednesday night and a high level of interest in all the sports offered. The coordinators for each sport will now begin sorting the teams.
