Dear parents, carers, students and community friends,

Our teachers have been busy writing student reports over the last two weeks ready for them to be checked and sent home on **Friday 22nd June**.

With the introduction of teaching and learning from the Australian Curriculum we also have some changes in the way teachers are required to report.

Although teachers will still assign grades from A - E for all students from yrs 1 - 7 the meaning of those grades, I believe, will be easier for parents, carers and students to understand. The new grading system is probably similar to what many of you grew up with.

Below is the grading and meaning of each grade that teachers now use when assigning levels for your child.

- A: your child is demonstrating **excellent** achievement of what is expected at this year level
- B: your child is demonstrating **good** achievement of what is expected at this year level
- C: your child is demonstrating **satisfactory** achievement of what is expected at this year level
- D: your child is demonstrating partial achievement of what is expected at this year level
- E: your child is demonstrating **minimal** achievement of what is expected at this year level

This year teachers are required to teach and report in maths and science from the Australian curriculum. All other subjects will be reported on using the existing South Australian Curriculum Standards and Accountability Framework. (SACSAF)

The Australian Curriculum has achievement standards which describe what students should typically be able to do, know and understand by the end of the year at each year level. Therefore the mid year report will reflect your child's achievement, demonstrated against the standard, taking into account what has been taught to this point in the year.

As a staff we are confident that the reports reflect our students' achievements to date. The accompanying descriptive comments in the report will give you more specific information than a grade. It is vital that if you have any concerns about your child's learning that you contact your child's teacher to discuss the issue and then we can work in partnership to support your child.


WELCOME AND ENJOY!
