## Class Placement for 2013

Parents are invited to write to the Principal regarding the educational needs of their child(ren) that are to be considered in the class placement process to be undertaken next term for 2013. Parents are asked to address specific learning issues related to each individual child and not to include specific teacher requests or year level structures.
For example, parents may describe the child's areas of interest or need for further development to consolidate learning. Reference could be made to a child's preferred classroom environment or social needs in a broad sense. Information that 'adds value' to the existing information we have about each child is what we are seeking.
This information should be forwarded in writing to the Principal, Wayne Hunt, by no later than Friday, September 21st, 2012. This information will be given to the teachers to consider in their decision making in the placement process.
After a thorough process, taking in information from a variety of sources, student placement will be communicated to parents and students either at the end of the school year or early in the new year, depending on the quality and timeliness of enrolment information forwarded to the school. The Principal has the responsibility for this process and for the final decisions made.
