## Classes for 2013

Placing children in class groups is a complex process which takes many weeks. The process takes account of information provided by parents, teachers and the students themselves. We aim to create class groups of students who can learn effectively together. Usually this means creating a group of students which has a gender balance, a range of learning abilities and a range of behaviour and social needs. Factors such as academic abilities, friendship groups, social and emotional maturity and even physical size are all considered when making up class groups.
As a principal new to the school I have been impressed by the effort of teachers to place every student in their class with care and consideration. They come to placement meetings highly prepared, with a clear understanding of the needs of their students. The focus is on placing current students and not on what class they will be teaching. They speak of student needs with understanding and respect, yet collaborate with their colleagues to try and accommodate the needs of all students and not just their own.
Not again! We began the class placement exercise two weeks ago, but have found that we need to change class structures and start all over again! This is due to late enrolments and late notification of students who are leaving the school. It surprises many parents to know that even 2 or 3 students above or below predictions at any one year level can cause major changes in a school's class structures overall. In order to form classes it is essential that we estimate our 2013 student numbers as exactly as possible. If your child will not be attending our school next year, please let us know ASAP. Alternatively, if you know of a child due to start school next year, please advise their parent to enroll them now!
When will we know? We are still working towards notifying students and parents of 2013 class placement information on Friday, December $7^{\text {th }}$.

## A Better Environment

Please pay the $\$ 10$ per student for the bus transport at the Front Office, or give the money to your child's class teacher. Buses will arrive at the front of the school (on West Parkway) at approx 8:30am Monday morning and each morning throughout the week. To assist the drivers we ask that you do not park in this area at that time. A reminder about Sun Safety - hats, sunscreen etc are vital. Please ensure that your child has sunscreen with them so that it can be applied at least 20 minutes prior to the lesson. Sun damage can occur even on overcast days! ## Reports of Illness

There have been two reports of contagious illnesses of late, one requiring restriction from school attendance and both a level of community awareness.
'Conjunctivitis' - An inflammation of the lining of the eye and eyelid caused by bacteria, viruses, chemicals or allergies.
Symptoms may include: redness in the whites of the eyes, irritation in one or both eyes, discharge, causing the eyelids to stick together in the morning, swelling of the eyelids or sensitivity to light.
Children should be excluded from child care, preschool, or school until discharge from the eyes has ceased.
Gastro - We have recently had a number of children away with Gastro. The incubation period (time between becoming infected and developing symptoms) for gastro is 24-72 hours. The infectious period (time during which an infected person can infect others) is during the illness and for at least 24 hours after symptoms have disappeared.
Children should be excluded from child care, preschool, school and work until there has been no diarrhoea or vomiting for 24 hours.
