### Dear parents, carers, students and community friends,

Welcome back to our assistant principal Louisa Guest and many thanks to Ashley Blight for undertaking Louisa's role in her absence. As always, our school is a vibrant, busy place filled with rich learning opportunities both in and out of the classroom. Thank you to parents for attending the parent teacher interviews. Teachers find them enormously useful in planning effectively for your child's learning and we hope parents discovered useful ways to support their children to be successful at school.

### **Fundraising across our school**

Each year at our school we raise funds for three different purposes. The first is for **charities**. This is run by the SRC and usually consists of four casual days or similar events. This year we have raised money for an orphanage in Cambodia and we are in the process of deciding (through class and SRC meetings) the other charities which will be supported.

The second is student fundraising for our school, raised through two discos and the Enterprise Day. The SRC have decided to raise funds toward the replacement of the 'obstacle course' **play equipment** which was removed from Mortlock Park. We are working closely with Mitcham Council on this.

The third type of fundraising is organised by parents, through the Fundraising Subcommittee of Governing Council. Their goal this year is to provide more **iPads** for every classroom. Events this year include the Veggie Box, Entertainment Book, Quiz Night etc.

These are all worthy goals which will be of great benefit to our students and others. Thank you to all families for their participation and support.

### **Enterprise Day**

The excitement is building! Classes have now organised their stall/activities and preparations are underway. For families new to our school who are wondering what it is all about, it's a student-run 'fete' between 12.30 and 2.00 on Wednesday April 10<sup>th</sup>. The money raised will be used for the play equipment. Students come to school as normal and bring approximately \$6-\$12 in change, depending on their age. During the 'fete' students take a turn helping on their stall and then wander between other stalls spending their money. Lots of parents choose to join the fun with their child or just to help out. ### **Uniform Committee**

Governing Council has authorised a review of uniform tops (polo shirts and jackets) and have formed a small committee to research possible options. This will take some time; there will be plenty of notice of any change to uniform and a change-over period, so you can feel free to go ahead with uniform purchases now. 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## Medications

If your child has medication kept in the front office, please come in and check the expiry date. There have been several ventolin inhalers that have expired. Please note that all medication must be in its **original container** with the **child's name**. No medication will be administered that is not prescribed by a doctor and a consent form filled out by parents and caregivers. Staff **cannot** give Panadol to students unless an authorisation form has been signed and given to staff. Parents or caregivers must supply Panadol for students.

Please ensure that students with life threatening conditions or students on long-term medication have an action plan from their doctor. Students are expected to take all medication such as Epipens or Ventolin when they leave the school for excursions. **It is important that parents monitor the expiry dates on long term medications and keep their child's action plan up to date.**

**Medication that needs to be taken 3 times a day should be given before school, after school and before bed.** This ensures that parents know their child has taken the correct dosage and is in line with DECD guidelines.
