## Dear parents, carers, students and community friends,

On any day you look around our school you will see many examples of the important part parents play in contributing to the learning program we offer the students.

We see parents helping in classrooms, on excursions or with SAPSASA sporting competitions, working with individual students and attending workshops to help their child's learning. At this time of year we see many parents taking on the role of sports coaches and team managers. Indeed, our courts and Mortlock Park are crammed with parents and students at after school practices! The various committees of Governing Council continue to meet to plan and monitor all the programs associated with our school.

### **NAPLAN**

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is an annual assessment for students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9. It has been an annual event for schools since 2008.

On Tuesday 14, Wednesday 15 and Thursday 16 May, students will take the 2013 NAPLAN tests. NAPLAN assesses skills in literacy and numeracy that are developed over time, through the school curriculum. NAPLAN is not a pass or fail type of test, but rather shows how students are progressing in numeracy and literacy skills against national standards for all Australian children. It also provides valuable information that allows schools and governments to better target support to help all students achieve their potential and acquire the basic skills to help them build successful and happy lives. NAPLAN tests fundamental skills rather than specific content, and as such is not a test for which students can study or drill. The best way you can help your child prepare for NAPLAN is to let them know that NAPLAN is just one part of their school program, and to urge them to simply do the best they can on the day, giving great effort.

An individual student NAPLAN report will be issued by the school later this year, usually in September. Parents can use this information to monitor how their child is progressing and to identify any areas of concern. Parents may also wish to use their child's results to discuss progress with teachers. ### **Year 8 enrolment forms**

A reminder to all parents of current Year 7 students that all 'Enrolment Forms for Year 8' must be returned by Friday 17<sup>th</sup> May. Irrespective of whether your child is going to private schooling, interstate, overseas etc these forms need to be returned with this information. It is vitally important that we stick to this timeline. Thanks in anticipation of your attendance to this matter. If you are applying for enrolment into an 'out of school zone' public high school, you must write a supporting letter addressing the 4 criteria listed on the top of page 2 of ED 176. This must be attached to the application form. Also, if parents are seeking a sibling right enrolment to an 'out of school zone' application, you must attach a copy of the older siblings current Student Photo ID to the application.


### **Material & Service Fees**

# Year 3/4 Aboriginal & Australian History Excursion
