Dear parents, carers and community friends,

We are currently focussing with the students on the CLG Expert Learner Quality of **Active Thinkers**.

Active Thinkers show initiative in applying thinking and questioning skills critically and creatively, to approach complex problems. They are innovative and make reasoned decisions.

We are talking with the students about this important learning skill and helping them to understand what it means. Some classes are doing this by teaching specific thinking skill strategies, such as the Thinking Hats. In other classes teachers are setting challenging tasks that require creative thinking and helping students to reflect on their thinking. One such task in Rooms 20 and 21 follows up on their study of a country and asks the students to design, plan and construct an item that represents the country they studied. They also need to write a procedural text explaining how to make the item. In Music an example of creative thinking is being provided with a selection of rhythms and asked to add a melody, or being shown part of a dance and being asked to create two new moves suitable to that type of dance.

At home, parents can help build active thinkers by making the child do the thinking rather than providing the answer. Questions that require critical thinking can be asked about movies, TV shows and everyday events. Two great questions for parents are 'What did you think of that?' and 'What makes you say that?'.

If parents wish to provide advice regarding their child's 2014 class placement they must do so by 9.00am tomorrow morning, Friday, October 25th. Thank you to the parents who have promptly notified us of any student moving school next year.

'Play is the Way' Training

On Monday November 4th the school will be closed to students while the staff work with Wilson McCaskill to train in the 'Play is the Way' program. We will be using this social and emotional child development program across the school in 2014, with a particularly strong emphasis in the first two weeks of school. 'Play is the Way' is a program of cooperative, physically interactive games that develop:

- Safety and non-violence
- Peer support, trust, respect and understanding
- Self-regulation and socially responsible behaviour
- Openness, acceptance and belonging


Please check your diaries and see if you can help in the Canteen in preparation for this term's special meal deal. We need help on the following days:
