Teachers are really looking forward to the opportunity for new learning on our **Pupil Free Day on Tuesday, March 11th** following the Adelaide Cup Public Holiday. The school will be closed to students and staff will be working with international educator and author Lee Crockett. Mr Crockett is the author of 'The Digital Generation', 'Teaching for Tomorrow' and 'More than Just Literacy' and will lead us in looking at the abilities our students will need for their future and ways to raise our school achievement standards through challenging students to improve their information fluency and solution fluency.

CLASS PARENT REPRESENTATIVES

This year we are beginning a system of Class Parent Representatives for classes from Reception to the Year 3/4 classes. Teachers of these classes have asked for two parents to be the Class Parent Representatives. The purpose of a Class Parent is to support communication between parents and build links among the school community. Some ways they may do this include:

Each year, Colonel Light Gardens enters the International Competitions and Assessments for Schools (ICAS) in Science, Mathematics and English. The papers are completed at school, in school hours in terms 2 and 3. It is a helpful way of building your child's self-esteem, broadening their horizons and giving them extra academic experience. Welcome back to a new school year and the eleventh year of the Premier's Reading Challenge in South Australia.

I am challenging South Australian students from Reception to Year 12 to read 12 books by 5 September 2014.

Also, for the first time, there will be a reader for life gold award presented to students who have completed the Premier's Reading Challenge eleven times.

The Premier's Reading Challenge continues to grow remarkably, with over 126 700 students completing the Challenge in 2013 from 688 schools and also from home education and individual student families. This is an increase of more than 2 470 students or over 1.9% from 2012.

Over 95% of all schools had students completing the Challenge. This is an outstanding achievement and I thank you all for your time and efforts in supporting children and their families to complete the Challenge.

I congratulate all participating schools on these fantastic results.

The Challenge is fortunate to have twenty two high profile and enthusiastic South Australian ambassadors who inspire students to enjoy reading and achieve their goals. Adelaide United Football Club, Link Lightning Basketball Club, Port Adelaide Football Club, Adelaide Football Club, Scorpions SA and Thunderbirds Netball Club have also thrown their support behind the Challenge.

The Premier's Reading Challenge continues to be an important initiative that supports the State Government's commitment to increase the literacy skills of young South Australians and encourage them to enjoy reading.
