**Dear parents, carers, students and community friends,**

### Learning for *their* future

Our teachers had a very informative, thought-provoking day on Tuesday listening to Lee Crockett who spoke about 21st Century education and the need to develop problem solving, creativity and collaborative thinking in students. He was very convincing about the need to use technology to help students improve their thinking and achievement, now and for their future. The information about our students' use of visual data was particularly interesting. We are educating our students for their future, not our text-based past.

It is true that the basic knowledge, skills and understandings of Literacy and Numeracy are still the 'bread and butter' of primary education, but we need to look at how we can develop them in ways that engage and challenge our students. There were some startling insights into the way our students use technology outside of school and as a result, implications for the way they think and learn. It was reassuring that our Expert Learner Qualities were strongly reflected in international thinking on the goals of education.

The tricky question is *how* we develop these qualities. We need to engage our students in relevant, realistic inquiries that challenge them to learn and apply new literacy, numeracy and technology skills and to think about 'big ideas', or concepts. They need to work together to do this in flexible groups and to contribute and create new ideas and learning.

It sounds so easy, but don't be fooled – its enormously challenging, especially when grappling with the complex and diverse educational and social needs of a class of students and a new curriculum. Our teachers continue to step up to the challenge and design inquiries and tasks which will be relevant and challenging. It's why we value the collaborative planning days in year level teams so highly.

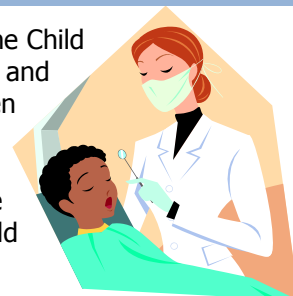
## VACATION CARE

Dental care is FREE for most children and the School Dental Service will bulk-bill Medicare.

Children who do not qualify for the Child Dental Benefits Schedule can still attend – a small fee may apply for each course of general dental care provided. There are no waiting times at the School Dental Service.
