We have been keeping statistics on the amount and type of technology use and it is apparent that the impact of more mobile technology is even stronger than we anticipated. The support we received in 2013 from the school community in fundraising toward this aim is starting to show a great effect. Thank you!

The variety of school learning events organised by our teachers continues to enrich our programmes but challenges you as parents to *keep up!* In this information-rich digital world we manage by making decisions about what we open, what we really read and what we delete. Please be careful that you at least open and skim our communications.

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IMPROVING OUR GROUNDS

Thank you to all the families who came to our Working Bee on Sunday morning. We had our best ever turn-out of about 20 adults and several past and present students, so we achieved many of the tasks on our ambitious list. We spread about 10 tonne of mulch and we planted over 50 plants. This was in addition to the usual tasks of weeding and cleaning.

Between the efforts of our parents and our hard-working groundsman, Bruce Ford, the school grounds have never looked better! And just wait until this time next year when our western grounds redevelopment is complete. The Grounds committee has prepared a design brief and is meeting with landscaping designers next week.

If you always approach our school from the western or northern directions and haven't had a chance to appreciate the gardens to the east of the school on the East Parkway side of Grange – take a couple of minutes and go for a walk inside our fence. You will think you are in a national park!

LIGHTING UP THE ARTS

'*LIGHTING UP THE ARTS*' is a special event for every Year 3-7 student, occurring every two years to celebrate the strong tradition of the performing arts in our school. It will be held on **Thursday, June 19th at 7:00pm in the Adelaide Town Hall.**

Please read the information below, so you can support your children and enjoy the event.

PROGRAM

The program lasts for 90 minutes and includes whole school (Y3-7) items, class items, performances from our choirs and rock band, 'Assisting Artists' and percussion ensembles. A written program is prepared and is introduced by comperes.

COSTUMES

The costuming is 'choral', i.e. coloured T-shirts and dark pants and shoes. This means the cost to parents is as low as possible and the effort from parents is minimal. Each class has particular coloured T-shirts which the students will need to buy. Class teachers will organise what sizes we order and give them out to students. The T-shirts will stay at school until the day of the concert. ***The T-shirts will cost \$6, GST inclusive. All parents will be sent an invoice for this amount.***

TICKETS

The tickets will cost \$16, GST inclusive. The ticket price is the same for everyone, children and adults alike. The tickets have been costed to cover the bus into the Town Hall for rehearsal, all venue, technician and instrument costs.

Tickets are ONLY sold through the school. They will be on sale from 8:30-10:30am and 2:30-3:30pm from the finance window from Monday June 2nd to Friday, June 13th.

There is no online or phone sales because the seats are numbered and parents need to buy specific seats. Every seat will have a ticket which will be collected by Adelaide Town Hall Ushers.

REHEARSALS

On the day of the 19th June we will have a dress rehearsal at the Town Hall. Students will leave our school by bus at 9:15am and return by 2:30pm. They will need to bring water, recess and lunch. We will need some parent help to transport all the instruments. Prior to the concert we will rehearse at school.

PARENT TASKS

LEADERSHIP TRAINING FOR SENIOR SRC STUDENTS

PARKING OBSESSION

I promise you we are not obsessed with parking rules! We are responding to parent and staff concerns and trying to make it convenient for parents and safer for our students. We really want to be able to provide areas where our parents can spend a couple of minutes to pick up or drop off their children and know they are always likely to find the space to do so. (Think about the pick-up/drop off at Adelaide Airport – that's what we're trying to achieve). It can work so well when everyone obeys the rules.

We would like to thank Mitcham Council for supporting this aim by sending parking inspectors to remind parents of the road rules.

On West Parkway and in the lane behind the school there are stretches of road designated 'No Parking'. This means:

- you CAN drop off and pick up passengers and/or goods
- you CAN leave your car and move up to 3 metres away
- you CAN do this as quickly as possible, in around 2 minutes. What you can't do is park there from 3:00pm and wait in the car for your children to finally turn up. Or quickly run into the school yard to get your children. These are areas for pre-arranged pick up as part of your normal routine.

Please establish clear routines and contingency plans. Children need to know what to expect after school and where to wait, as well as what to do if their parent/adult doesn't arrive.

Another thing to consider is timing. There is a teacher on duty until 3:30 pm. By 3:25 the 'rush hour' has passed and you will be able to find a park. Train your children to wait in a certain place and to be a little bit patient.



Also, if parents are seeking a sibling right enrolment to an 'out of school zone' application, you must attach a copy of the older sibling's current Student Photo ID to the application. If your child has been accepted to a particular school, please make sure you tick the corresponding box. IF you haven't returned the form, please do so ASAP.


