Dear parents, carers, students and community friends,

I often refer to the third term as our 'premiership quarter'. Teachers and students have worked together to establish class learning expectations; teachers know their students and have put into place the possible accommodations to support success. In Term 3 teachers stretch the challenge, involving students in deeper thinking.

As we walk around the school and visit classrooms on a daily basis, the leadership team is impressed by the high level of teacher expectations and student engagement and the broad range of learning activities in which our students are involved. The students have the opportunity to make choices and reflect on success. There are also plenty of examples of the explicit teaching of skills and practise of fluency. Many students are now working on units of inquiry from the history, geography and science curriculum areas, researching in pairs or small groups in response to questions they have posed themselves.

Great group skills!

Last week our older classes participated in the 'Lab on Legs' science program. This is a travelling science laboratory that moves to schools across the state and engages students in conducting experiments and solving scientific problems. After two days of working with our students the presenter commented that he was 'awestruck' by the excellent group learning skills they demonstrated. Not just by their ability to get along, but also by their ability to work collaboratively and inclusively to solve problems.

Independence Day

Last Friday the four Reception classes in Doolette held their first Independence Day for the year. This is when our Reception students wave their parents goodbye at the door to Doolette and take responsibility for organising themselves for their day. It was such a great success that the Reception teachers have declared every Friday an Independence Day!

In the Press

Did you notice the mentions of our school in the last issue of the Mitcham Council News? The Mitcham Council thanked our Student Representative Council for their part in designing the playground and for raising \$10,000 toward the cost. Our Lighthouse 40 mentoring project was also included, asking for interested people to become mentors. We have already attracted three new mentors as a result!


