Dear parents, carers, students and community friends,

As we finish the busy winter sports season it's timely to celebrate the important place of Sport in the curriculum at Colonel Light Gardens Primary, reflect on our participation and thank all those involved.

Participation in out of hours Sport continues to grow each year. In 2014 we have fielded 11 netball teams, the most for several years. We even needed to access an extra netball court and are grateful to Mitcham Council and local residents for supporting our cause. Sue Camero and Teresa Rosenzweig worked as a team to coordinate the netball program. Olivia Kemp stepped forward to coordinate the 8 soccer teams and the season went smoothly, thanks to her efforts and the support of coaches. Football got off the ground under the coordination of Kendall Zimmerman with 4 teams drawn from our school, although many were combined with students from other schools. Again, this was the strongest participation in football for many years.

Our thanks to all the coaches, team managers and volunteers who brave the winter wind and chill to help our students develop their skills and participation. Your work is greatly appreciated by the school community.

As well as the out of hours sport, many of our students have participated in inter-school competitions run through SAPSASA. In this competition we select our best representatives to compete against other schools and perhaps be selected for the District or State teams. This year we have competed in cricket, basketball, table tennis, netball, soccer, football, cross county and swimming. This week we took a team of 61 students to the District Athletics carnival and a team of 48 students to Orienteering Relay Championships. Next term students will be participating in knockout softball competitions, tennis clinics and celebrating PE Week with an emphasis on promoting active and healthy living. All students appreciate the opportunity to test their abilities against the best from other schools.

Thank you to our PE teacher, Kim Boothey for all the work she has put into selecting, training and organising teams. She has been strongly supported by parent volunteers and sports coaches.

The remaining weeks of the term are still busy with physical education events as part of the learning program. Over the next two weeks students in Reception to Year 5 will be going swimming at the Westminster Indoor Pool and we have already started training and doing run-offs for Sports Day on Thursday September 25th.

We commend the students involved in all these sporting activities on their excellent attitude and teamwork and on their demonstration of the principles of fair play.

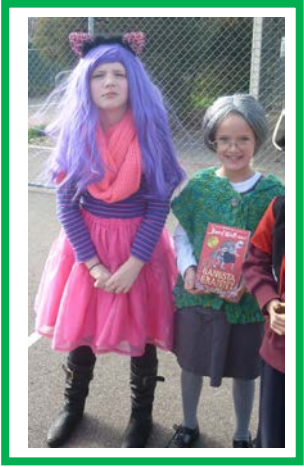
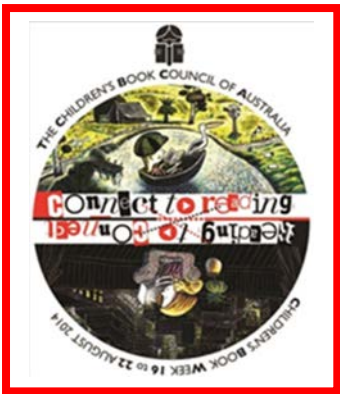
