Dear parents, carers, students and community friends,

### A busy term ahead

Term 4 is lots of fun for students, packed with events such as discos, casual days, class parties and the concert – to name just a few. Parents can find it quite a challenge to keep up, especially if they have a few children at school! Our advice? Use the term calendar and read the newsletter and blogs. We work really hard to plan ahead and keep parents informed, but you need to actually read what is sent. Please don't rely on your children to keep you informed. They are notoriously selective and last-minute in their communication!

### Classes and class placements in 2015

Estimating how many students at each year level in 2015 is a tricky business! If your child is unlikely to be attending our school in 2015 can you please make sure you have notified us in writing. Even one or two students at a year level can make a difference to class structures.

Every year we offer parents the opportunity to contribute to the class placement process by making comments about what they believe their child needs for the following year. Many years, parents have nothing extra to add to teacher understanding and don't send in a comment. Other times they have something important to say and decide to send in a request.

Parent comments and requests are given equal but not greater rating to those of students and of teachers. All comments are considered carefully as contributing to a thorough understanding of student needs.

*This year we are asking parents to prioritise their requests.* Frequently parents who send in comments ask for several things, not all of which can be met.

To assist parents to clarify their views and make helpful requests we have developed a 2015 Class Placement Request form which is available from the school office. If you intend to put in a request this year please use this form.

## BYOD: Bring Your Own Device

In 2013 the Fundraising Committee recognised the value of mobile technology devices and raised funds to provide pods of iPads. The school dismantled one computer room and bought trolleys of laptops and iPads. In 2014 the Governing Council allocated funds to purchase iPads for students with learning disabilities.

The impact of the increased access to mobile technology has been immediately apparent. Bookings for the mobile laptop/ipad trolleys have more than doubled in less than 12 months and teachers and students have been excited by the opportunities for learning that are available. Behaviour incidents for students with learning disabilities have decreased dramatically as these students have become engaged in the general class learning through being provided with a personalised but related curriculum.

Learning technologies are most effective when students have access to their own personal device, when they need it, not when it's their turn. It's also important for students to be using a personal device that has their own work on it, one that they can take home.



So in 2015 we have invited students *in Years 6 & 7 only* to connect their device to our school network to use for their learning (and only for their learning). Students can use the devices for internet searching during research, for presentations and film making, and work can be emailed to the teacher for assessment and feedback.

Students are expected to follow the CLG **ICT Use Agreement** and CLG **Behaviour Expectations** at all times.

**All Year 6 and 7 students in 2015 are invited to bring, connect and use their own device for learning at school.**

Please note:

- Students don't have to bring a personal device to school, but they can, with parental agreement.
- Students who don't BYOD will have access to school iPads and computers.
- iPad minis (or iPads) are recommended as they are not too big on busy desks but the screen and keypad are big enough for writing. They also have a range of quality educational apps and easy film making apps.
- Students will not share their device with other children and need to take responsibility for keeping it safely stowed in their tray/bag when not in use and for charging it overnight.
- The devices will not be used for activities other than the learning program during school time. Recess and Lunch time are Screen Free times. Devices stay inside.
- Internet access will go through all the normal filtering that the school devices use.

At Colonel Light Gardens Primary School we want our children to develop and learn in a contemporary learning environment appropriate to their age and stage of development. We want them to build their responsibility and skills along the way, as Expert Learners

In Term 4 last year 111 parents accessed the Parent Opinion Survey to provide feedback to our school. - Swimming lessons moved indoors

- Teacher training in differentiating curriculum begun and attention paid to students at both ends of the achievement 'spectrum' (this is an ongoing work in progress).
