

Dear Parents, carers, students and community friends,

At the AGM of Governing Council recently, the school's 2015 Annual Report was presented. It is now available on the school's website. While fairly long, the report does contain some interesting data about the school.

In 2015 for the first time our Year 6 and 7 students participated in the Middle Years Development Index. This involved an on-line survey of 14 aspects of well-being. The results were very interesting and we have been able to compare them to the other schools in our Partnership and the average across the State.





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While our students had higher levels of self-esteem they were lower on perseverance and this is the case across our Partnership schools. This can have an impact not only upon well-being but also on academic achievement. It could be hypothesised that the difficulty we have in moving students into the higher achievement bands is related to a tendency for them to 'give up' on a problem too early. As teachers and parents we will need to train ourselves to wait and let children struggle with tasks rather than offer the answer or strategy.

Recently the Leadership team attended a conference on developing a 'Growth Mindset'. Having a growth mindset allows students to think that they can achieve success if they work towards something, accept feedback and do purposeful practice of tasks that are just a little bit too hard. It isn't just accepting that its OK to make mistakes when you are learning, it's about the response to the mistakes, about learning from them and then making less mistakes.

This means that the focus of learning should be about both the content and the process of learning. As part of the normal classroom routine students learn about learning. Success comes from developing your Expert Learner Qualities, not "having" those qualities. You will hear lots more about 'Growth Mindset' as we work with our students to develop themselves as learners.

JAPANESE JUNCTION ~ where you find cool facts and info.....

This week's introduction: Shinkansen (Bullet Train)

Shinkansen which is also known as the Bullet Train by western countries (because of its shape) is the world's first high- speed train and rail system which originated in Japan and began operating between Tokyo and Osaka in 1964.

Commuter trains throughout the world operate at less than 100km/h in normal circumstances but high speed trains must have a minimum speed of at least 250km/h. Japan Railways Group pioneered the Shinkansen, which has a safe operating speed of 320km/h and known as one of the fastest train service systems in the world.

However, the most astonishing facts of this system is neither the speed nor its cool looking carriages, they are;



- 1. **Construction and Infrastructure** Unlike other countries where you can find high speed rail systems, the following needed to be solved.
 - 70% of Japan is mountainous so they needed to construct many tunnels and overcome curves of the rails etc.
 - How to operate in adverse weather conditions such as heavy snows in the North.
 - Natural disasters e.g. Earthquakes
 - Noise reduction was another hurdle to be solved as it's a very populated country.
- 2. **Safety and Maintenance** Shinkansen has amazing technology in order to run safely.
 - It is controlled to automatically stop if it breaches a certain distance between itself and another train in front
 - There are sensors throughout Japan which consistently monitor for any tremor or possible earthquake and in the event of a threat, will send a signal and halt the train before the tremor or earthquake actually hits.
 - Quality of maintenance and check-up is beyond imagination. There have been no accidents due to system failure or faults since its launch more than 50 years ago!
- 3. **Operation and Control** This reminds me of the scene in Chaplin's 'Modern Times'.
 - Shinkansen runs every 3-5 min on 7 different lines simultaneously compared to other major high- speed rail systems in the world which usually run every hour.
 - Each service is expected to operate within a 12 sec delay (maximum) and this is such a high expectation yet
 - amazingly data shows that of all the 120,000 Shinkansen services that operate between Tokyo and Osaka (515km), have an annual average of only 36 seconds delay combined! This means that 99.9% of the services operate on time.

Does the above sound familiar to you???? Yes!!! Because this is what we do at CLG.

Construction and Infrastructure – creating effective learning environments for our students.

Safety and Maintenance – maintaining an environment for our students where they can feel safe and secure.

Operation and Control - providing innovative and up to date methods of learning programs for our students through the knowledge and expertise of our staff and the wider community.

Finally, a new line to Kanazawa has been operating for the past year and another line to Hokkaido via the world's longest underwater tunnel is due to open this month! Also a new super hi tech Maglev line is in production which will see speeds of up to 505km/h. If Australia had this system it would enable our students to visit Melbourne on a one day excursion!!!

You never know....one day, you may get to enjoy the ride!!!
