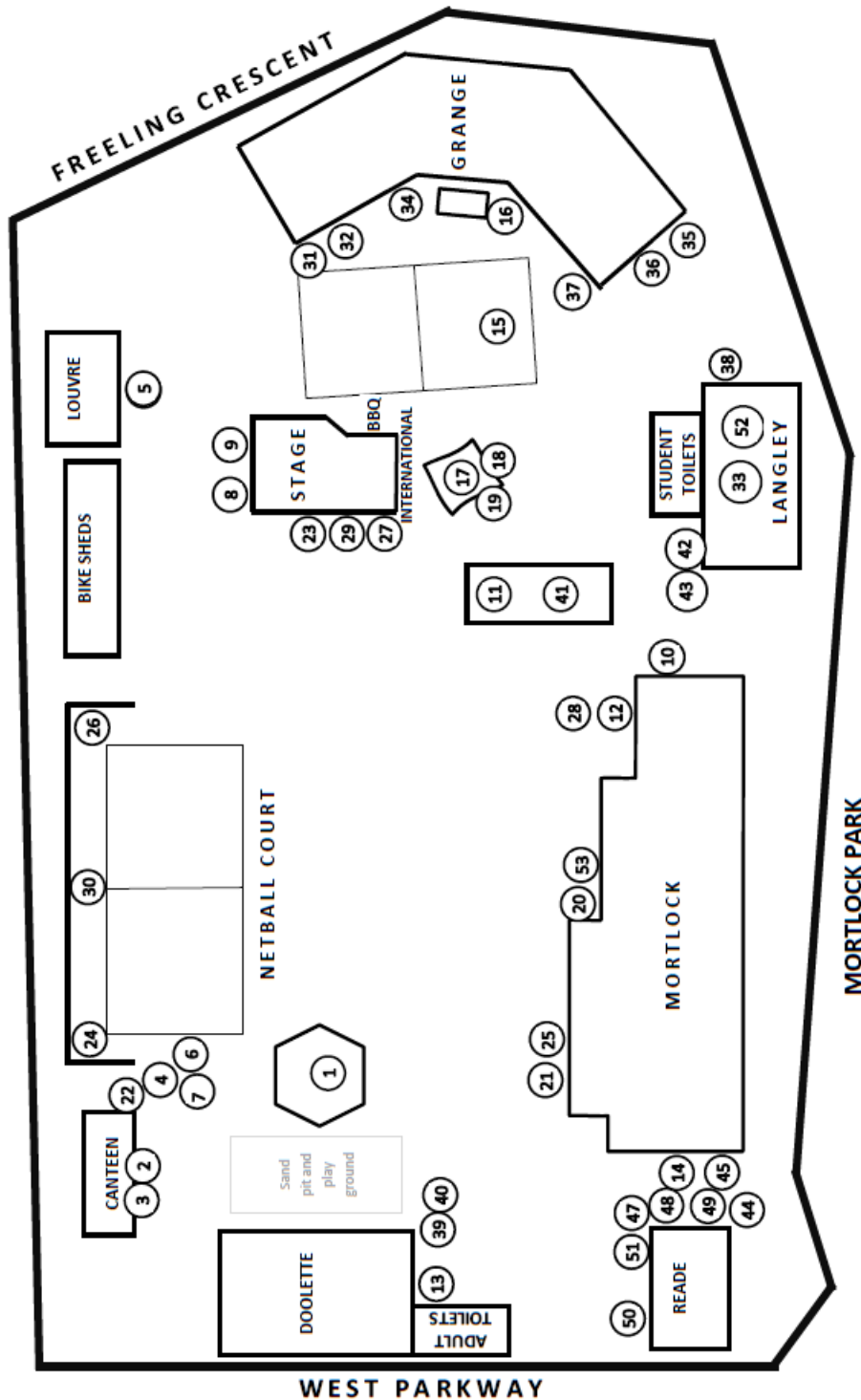


ENTERPRISE DAY 2016

Welcome to our 2016 Enterprise Day, an example of real-life learning for our students in the curriculum area of Business and Economics and financial literacy. We hope the information below helps you enjoy the day:

Sales take place from 12.:30 to 2:00pm only, no 'early bird' sales.

Students *may bring between \$5 and \$15*, depending upon their age. Students will need a shopping bag to carry their purchases – and so may you!

Canteen: There will be no canteen for either recess or lunch on Enterprise Day.

Parking: In the laneway and on West Parkway (be gone before 3pm); at the Baseball Club car park and walk across the oval; and in the streets surrounding the school. Please be considerate of our neighbours and do not park across or very close to driveways.
