WHY WOULD WE BOTHER?

This week our Year 7 students, and next week the Year 6s, are going on camp to Wirraway. Last term Rooms 11 and 12 went to Narnu on Hindmarsh Island and five middle primary classes went to Arbury Park Outdoor School. In Term 4 Rooms 16 and 19 will go on a camp to Mylor. This means all our Primary students will be offered a camp.

From the plethora of forms and information that comes home, parents will understand the great responsibility and legal requirements of taking children on camp. It is not a DECD requirement to do so and there is no school policy requiring teachers to take their classes on camp. Why would teachers bother?

Camps are a valuable teaching and learning experience, providing an opportunity for students to learn from the wider community, build on the classroom curriculum and reinforce school based learning. Camps can greatly enhance the progress of this learning, offering new, varied, challenging and practical experiences across the learning areas.

PRINCIPAL'S NEWS CONTINUED...

Taking students on Camp offers many opportunities to develop the cross-curriculum priorities and general capabilities of the Australian Curriculum. This can include understandings about such complex ideas as 'sustainability.'

Camps also offer an excellent opportunity for students to develop personal and social capability as they learn to understand themselves and others, and manage their relationships. Personal and social capability involves students recognising and regulating emotions, developing empathy for others, making responsible decisions, working effectively in teams, handling challenging situations constructively and developing leadership skills.

While your children will come home with many stories about the challenges and excitement of their camp, we hope parents can read between the lines and see the wonderful learning that has taken place. Thank you to all our teachers who have been willing to accept the challenge and responsibility of camps, in order to provide these learning opportunities for their students.



NAPLAN

Next week, on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday mornings our students in years 3, 5, and 7 will sit the NAPLAN tests. Parents don't need to do anything special, just make sure your child has a good night's sleep and gets to school on time!

ARE YOU AT SCHOOL TODAY?

The current attendance goal set by DECD is for all schools to achieve 95% student attendance in 2016. Unfortunately we are unlikely to meet this goal due to the very large number of students who stay away for 'family reasons' or for family holidays. While the learning that takes place on holidays is well understood, as is the much cheaper costs outside of school holidays, it still has an effect on your child's learning. 'Family reasons' seems to cover a range of reasons, everything from a day off school for a birthday to meeting visitors at the airport!

Something to think about:

10 minutes late each day = 1 ½ days missed per term

12 days absent per term = 25% of schooling missed

48 days by the end of the year = 1 year of schooling missed every 4 years.

So, if a student were to go to the end of Year 12 he / she would have missed 3 years of schooling.

To date this year our absences by reason are:

40% student illness

27% exemption for family holiday

17% 'family reasons'

16% unexplained and still being chased up by teachers.

This means that nearly 44% of absences are potentially avoidable!

A 95% attendance rate would mean no more than 10 days absent for the year. Will your child achieve this level of

attendance?

FINANCE NEWS

MATERIALS & SERVICES CHARGE

Thank you to the families that have either paid their school fees, entered a direct debit instalment plan or applied for school card. Unless you have signed a pay-by-instalment plan or are awaiting school card assessment, school fees are overdue. Governing Council has endorsed the Debt Collection Policy for 2016 and unpaid fees will be sent to debt collection. *Please contact Amanda Jackson as soon as possible if you need to discuss payment*.

AVAILABLE METHODS FOR PAYMENTS

The payment window is open from 8:30am – 11:00am every morning. **No money can be accepted after this time for security reasons.** Each class has a finance folder to collect small amounts of cash for excursions etc and this is then sent to the Front Office each morning. If money is sent to school with your child, please ensure that it is placed in a sealed envelope clearly marked with the child's name and room number. This money can be given to either the class teacher or the cashier. If you would like to pay using a credit card, we are able to take your credit card details and process the payment the following morning.

Alternatively excursions, sports fees and other charges can be paid with a credit card, using BPoint, an online payment system. Go to www.colgrdnsps.sa.edu.au and select online payments. Please note there are two payment icons, one for School and the other for OSHC. Payments to OSHC must be through the OSHC icon, payments for school related expenses must be through the school icon.

YEAR 7 - YEAR 8 TRANSITION

A reminder to all parents of current Year 7 students - all 'Enrolment Forms for Year 8' – Forms must be returned by Wednesday 25TH May. Irrespective of whether your child is going to private schooling, interstate, overseas etc these forms need to be returned with this information. It is vitally important that we stick to this timeline. Thanks in anticipation of your attendance to this matter.

If you are applying for enrolment into an 'out of school zone' public high school, you must write a supporting letter addressing the 4 criteria listed on the top of page 2 of ED 176. This must be attached to the application form.

Also, if parents are seeking a sibling right enrolment to an 'out of school zone' application, you must attach a copy of the older sibling's current Student Photo ID to the application.

If your child has been accepted to a particular school, please make sure you tick the corresponding box.


