PRINCIPAL'S NEWS CONTINUED...

SEMESTER 1 REPORTS

Our semester one written reports will be sent home on Friday, July 1st (tomorrow). Teachers put an enormous amount of work and thought into the grades and comments they provide. We hope that parents will look carefully at all three aspects of the report, which when read together should give you a thorough understanding of how your child is doing, and where they can further improve. The 3 components are:

- Achievement levels. The grades are decided through evidence by assessing student learning against the achievement standards outlined in the Australian Curriculum for all subject areas. A grade is allocated in line with the the Australian curriculum. A 'Satisfactory' rating, equates to a 'C', and is given to a student who achieves the year level achievement standard. To get an 'Excellent' rating is something very superior. An 'excellent' student not only shows an advanced understanding of the knowledge, skills and understandings of the subject but can apply them in new and unfamiliar contexts. The Australian Curriculum achievement standards can be accessed at www.australiancurriculum.edu.au
- Effort rating. It is important to look at this in relation to the achievement level. It will give an indication of how much room for improvement the teacher believes exists.
- Explanatory comments focus on areas of strength and goals for further improvement in English and Maths in some detail. The general comment can refer to social or work skills or to other areas of the curriculum. In this section, teachers often highlight a focus area for the remainder of the year

DRESS CODE

Colonel Light Gardens has an agreed dress code with a range of options for students to wear. Most students wear our school uniform, with pride, however I have noticed that a few students in the school are not complying with the school's expectations by wearing a different coloured hoodie or skivvy under their polo top or pinafore that is not a school approved colour. Some pants, shorts and shirts are also not part of the approved dress code. So we are all clear, early next term I will be sending home some information highlighting to parents and students what can and can't be worn to school. After speaking with the Governing Council and staff, we will be having a renewed focus on our school dress code. I firmly believe that all students need to be dressed in our school uniform as part of their commitment to and pride in our school.

DP MESSAGES

NATIONALLY CONSISTENT DATA COLLECTION ON SCHOOL STUDENTS WITH DISABILITY

We have commenced the annual nationally consistent collection of data on school students with disability ('the Collection'). This will involve the collection of: the number of students receiving adjustments to enable them to participate in education on the same basis as other students; the level of adjustment provided to students; and where known, the student's type of disability.

Under the Collection model the definition of disability is broad and includes learning difficulties, health and mental health conditions. If your child is identified for inclusion in the Collection, the required information about your child will be included in this year's data collection. Once the data has been collated, it will be de-identified before providing it to the Australian Government Department of Education. This ensures that no student's identity can be reasonably ascertained.

The data will be used by our school to inform and improve practice for students with disability and by the Department for Education and Child Development to inform state-wide reform initiatives. The Australian Government Department of Education will use the information collected to inform national policy development.

There will be plenty to go round! Visit the stand to receive a free Rockit apple.






SCHOOL STUDENT ARRIVAL TIMES

Could you please arrange for your child to arrive at school no earlier than 8.30am or make alternate care arrangements. The contact number for OSHC, if required, is 8276 9065.

We also ask for students' safety, that they do not play on the Mortlock playground <u>before school</u> unless directly supervised by their carers as this area is outside our usage agreement at that time and is not under supervision. After 8.30am all students should be in the school yard where there is a staff member on duty.




