

## PARENT ENGAGEMENT IN EDUCATION

### LEARNING POTENTIAL WEBSITE AND APP

Parents, families and carers are a child's first and most important teachers. [Parent Engagement In Education](#) is about parents being positively involved in their child's learning and school community - to help them learn and enjoy school.

As a parent, you and your family play an important role in supporting your child's education. The earlier you and your family become engaged, the better it is for your child's learning. Parent engagement is more than being involved and informed about school activities. It is actively engaging with your child's learning, both in the home and at school. When schools and families work together, children do better and stay in school longer.

For this reason, 'Engaging Parents In Education' is one of the four pillars of the Australian Government's [Students First](#) approach for quality school education.

#### What can parents do?

Being positively involved in your child's learning can help them to do better at school, be more engaged with their school work, go to school more regularly, and have better behaviour and social skills. There are simple things you can do to support your child's education. It doesn't take much to make a big difference!

Research has identified five ways that you can make a big difference to your child's learning:

1. set positive expectations
2. have regular conversations
3. support good study habits
4. encourage reading
5. build a partnership with your child's teachers

The Learning Potential app is full of tips and ideas on how to put these ideas into practice, with specific suggestions depending on whether your child is under five, in primary school, or in high school.

## RELEVANT HISTORY SCREENING & RAN TRAINING

At the beginning of the school year, DECD changed the requirement for **ALL** adults to have a DCSI Relevant History Screening when volunteering within a school. It is however, a very useful thing to have as it means we can invite you to school camps and excursions, you can volunteer to be a sports coach and much more!

All non-parent volunteers (e.g. community mentors, grandparents and other family members), require a DCSI Relevant History Screening. If you do not have a current Relevant History Clearance, please **email:** [dl.0723.info@schools.sa.edu.au](mailto:dl.0723.info@schools.sa.edu.au) or **call:** 8276 1523 and we shall get that process under way for you.

Part of working with children as a volunteer includes attending a brief, one hour (usually a bit shorter) workshop we refer to as **RAN Training** ("Responding to Abuse and Neglect"), historically referred to as "Mandatory Reporting".

We run these sessions a couple of times each term. If you have not completed this RAN workshop and need to do so, the next workshops are planned for:

## SWIMMING WEEK

### 2016 WATER SAFETY & AWARENESS PROGRAM

It is an exciting time during our Swimming weeks and here is some information to support families. The program is run by Austswim qualified instructors, with the aim of the program to teach students how to swim effectively with a strong focus on learning water safety, dry rescue, survival and endurance techniques. Students will be travelling by bus to the pool. The cost of the swimming lessons is paid for by the school and the cost of transport is paid for by families.

***Payments were due by 19th August - if your child's fees are still unpaid, please rectify ASAP.***

**Payment:** You can return money to front office or pay online using a credit card via the school website.

**Reference:** 'Swimming 2016'.

If your child has asthma, please ensure that any puffers left at school are in date and if your child cares for their own puffer, that they bring that in-date puffer each day they go swimming. If you have any questions about medications, please see Megan in the front office.

#### **Please read the following information about parents attending swimming lessons:**

If you intend on attending swimming lessons to support your child with changing and taking them to the toilet during lesson time, you must have a suitable Relevant History Screening. When children are getting organised before and after swimming, parents are only able to assist their own child with getting dressed and changed. If another child needs assistance, please notify their teacher. If you are planning on attending swimming to watch your own child then you may do so but if you do not have the suitable Relevant History Screening you may only watch the lessons and leave those with a Relevant History Screening to support students.

There are some safety considerations that the swimming centre ask us to communicate to parents who are planning to visit the pool. Please also keep the following in mind when visiting the pool;

- It is requested that prams or younger children are not brought to the pool.
- Parents need to stay at least 2m from the pool edge as equipment and wet surfaces are a tripping hazard.
- Parents need to be identified by wearing a name badge, provided by the classroom teacher. This badge needs to be worn at all times while in the swimming centre.
- Keep in mind that this program has a strong emphasis on water safety, awareness and survival skills /strokes. If parents want to discuss any matter regarding their child's class allocation or skill development can they please talk to school teachers in the first instance then (if needed) the Instructor in Charge can assist with any further queries or information requested. It is not appropriate for parents to discuss their child's progress directly with the instructor as supervision of students in the water can be compromised.
- Photography is not permitted in the centre. Parents are respectfully requested not to bring photographic equipment into the centre or use mobile phone cameras.
- All students in the change room will be supervised by suitable DCSI screened adults.

We appreciate your understanding to ensure that swimming lessons are an enjoyable and safe experience for the children involved.

# Japan Junction ~ Where you'll find cool facts and info.....

This week's introduction: *Hikone*

If you look at map of Japan, it is not difficult to identify a lake in the central region. Lake Biwa is the largest in Japan and named after a Biwa lute (a 7<sup>th</sup> century guitar like instrument) because of its shape.

Hikone City is located on the eastern side of this lake in Shiga Prefecture. It's on the Shinkansen route and therefore has great access to major cities like Kyoto (20mins), Osaka (40mins) and Nagoya (30mins). Hikone is one of many castle cities in Japan and Hikone Castle is a symbol and pride of the city. This 400-year-old castle is beautifully preserved in its original condition and a popular tourist destination all year round.



So... why am I talking about this city? There is a very special reason for it and Hikone has just become a very important place for CLG.

As you may know, we had visitors from Hikone in week 3. They were the Principal and 2 staff teachers from Sawayama Elementary School, which was founded in 1892 and today has approximately the same number of students as CLGPS.

To cut a long story short, they discovered us recently and they came all the way just to promote and cement our relationship. The visitors had a wonderful time meeting our students and staff and they were extremely impressed with our values and how we do things in the CLGPS way. We organized a special assembly and the visitors performed a Samurai dance. It was a huge hit and it goes without saying that our students enjoyed learning and performing the dance too!

In conclusion, both CLG and Sawayama Elementary School have agreed on forming a sister school relationship!! We have started planning this exchange program on how to support and maintain our future with Sawayama e.g. communication with regular posts of school information and students works etc. And guess what?

You never know... a Japan trip, with a visit to Hikone may become a reality in the near future for our students! It's still in the chrysalis stage so please watch this space!!

So let's celebrate the birth of this great friendship which spans 8000km across the Pacific!!



Each fortnight, this new section of the newsletter will provide parents with a glimpse at educational research based on neuroscience, how the brain learns and how this knowledge can support the learning of the students at CLG.

## TOPIC 1: GROWTH VERSUS FIXED MINDSETS

**Dr Carol Dweck**, a professor of psychology at Stanford University, studies the mindset of children or how they think about their abilities. She believes that children are similar to adults in that they have one of two possible mindsets – a **fixed mindset** or a **growth mindset**.

Kids with a fixed mindsets believe they are 'smart' or 'dumb', talented at something; painting, music or football, or not. They believe the world is made of some gifted people, whom the rest admire from the sidelines. Alternatively, kids with a growth mindset appreciate that anyone can build themselves into anything they want to be. They recognise that people aren't 'smart' or dumb', only hard working people who have chosen to take their abilities to the next level.

Dweck's research shows that students' beliefs about intelligence play an important role in their school achievement, engagement and happiness.

*"We found that students' mindsets – how they perceive their abilities- played a key role in their motivation and achievement, and we found that if we changed students' mindsets, we could boost their achievement. Students who believed their intelligence could be developed (a growth mindset) outperformed those who believed their intelligence was fixed (a fixed mindset)"*


### How can you as a parent help your child to develop a growth mindset?

Tips for promoting a growth mindset in kids:

1. **Help children understand that the brain works like a muscle**, that can only grow through hard work, determination and lots and lots of practice.
2. **Don't tell students they are smart, gifted or talented**, since this implies that they were born with knowledge, and does not encourage growth or effort.
3. Let kids know when they demonstrate a **growth mindset**.
4. **Praise the process**. It's effort, hard work and practice that allow children to achieve their true potential.
5. **Don't praise the results**. Test scores and rigid ways of measuring learning and knowledge limit the growth that would otherwise be tapped.
6. **Embrace failures and mistakes**. Children sometimes learn the most when they fail. Let them know that mistakes are a big part of the learning process. There is nothing like the feeling of struggling through a very difficult problem, only to finally break through and solve it! The harder the problem, the more satisfying it is to find the solution.
7. **Don't ask your kids what they enjoyed at school today**, but rather what did you find challenging? Focus on the effort and mistakes that were made.
