
CANTEEN NEWS

DIGITAL TECHNOLOGIES AT CLGPS

Last term, we held a very successful parent and child workshop on Digital Tools for learning. Approximately 50 families attended the evening and had lots of fun learning together. A parent also showed us a demonstration of 3D printing. After reading this summary of each workshop, you may be interested to come along with your children next year!

SPHERO WORKSHOP – definitely our most popular workshop! Spheros are programmable robotic balls – a little bit like BB8 from Star Wars, without the head. At first, the children simply learn to control the sphero using the ipad as a joystick/game controller. Once they understand how the robot moves, they move onto to simple programming by using an app called "Draw and Drive" and drawing the path they want the robot to take and sending the information to the sphero. Next they move onto a visual programming program called Tickle, where the students drag blocks of program into a sequence to get the sphero to do a specific thing.

EV3 MINDSTORMS – the concept to programming these Lego bricks is very similar to the spheros. The programming is also a visual one where the students drag blocks of code into a sequence to tell the robot what to do. There are a lot more options and the coding goes a lot deeper with sensors and much more sophisticated parameters that need to be set.

GREEN SCREENS – the students enjoyed learning how to use the iPad to video themselves in front of our green screen and then work on the macbooks to edit the film into a short movie. We had students "visit" Paris and "go on" a safari. They were very creative!

UNPLUGGED – unplugged coding activities are the basis of all computer work. Children need to be able to think computationally, that is, to think and plan sequentially and to be able to state this sequence of events in some form. The younger students enjoyed using the life size game grid to play games and give commands to their parents and friends to get them to navigate their way around the grid, being careful not to go on squares that had obstacles! They then invented ways with drawing, writing and using symbols, to share their sequence.

SCRATCH – code.org website is a fantastic resource for students from years 3 and up to learn about basic programming. You can do one-off activities on the website, "an hour of code", or you can sign up and access approximately 20 hours of free, sequenced lessons on how to program using the scratch interface. By the end of that, students should be able to create their own simple games

PUPPET PALS – students used this app to tell short stories. They learned to import their own backgrounds into the app and create their own characters with the camera and cutting tool.

WRITERS WORKSHOP– participants in this workshop used the storybird and Night Zookeeper websites. The websites provide a forum to share stories as well as provide lots of scaffolds and prompts to enable the children to write quality stories.

BEEBOTS- always a hit, these little robots build on from the unplugged activities. The concepts are the same but instead of moving a human around a life-size grid, children program the beebots to navigate a grid marked out in 15cm squares.

ICAS RESULTS

ICAS assessments have taken place annually in schools for over thirty years and in 20 countries. Educational Assessment Australia (EAA), who design and deliver the assessments, is the not-for-profit arm of the University of New South Wales.

ICAS:

- is an annual skills development assessment program in key areas of learning for students in Years 2-12;
 assessments are available in Computer Skills, English, Mathematics, Science, Spelling and Writing
- gathers performance information through a 30–60 minute supervised in-school test
- provides a continuous, independent and comprehensive record of a student's performance, as well as mapping their development over the full period of primary and secondary schooling
- enables the progress of each student to be mapped in each skill against their previous performance, demonstrating personal improvement no matter the starting point
- uses fellow students' results as a reference point; results are mapped against all students sitting at the same year level in Australia
- provides an excellent preparation for national testing
- enables students at all levels of ability to participate; ICAS contains questions designed to specifically explore the abilities of students of all standards – this includes those of both lower and higher levels of achievement
- medals are awarded to the top students in each subject in each school year in each state when sufficiently
 meritorious and the test was sat on the official test date.

We are very proud of the students who sat the tests in 2016. They showed the expert learner qualities of risk taking in having a go – the tests certainly aren't easy.
