### KERN M - CLG's INVENTOR EXTRAORDINAIRE!

Kern, in Year 7, entered this year's Little Big Ideas competition. He has explained his invention below.

I have designed and built my Smart Sprinkler using the Lego Mindstorms EV3 brick which I entered into the Little Big Idea competition.

My Smart Sprinkler saves water by avoiding obstacles like footpaths, driveways and fences. The owner uses an infra-red remote control to map out the boundary of the garden. It stores the radius distance for each rotational angle in memory. From this it works out the tilt angle of the sprinkler arm which moves up or down according to how far the water sprays.

I have won a trip to NASA and can't wait to go!
