Last week CLG had the pleasure of hosting 5 teachers from primary schools in the Guangdong province in China. The teachers spent time observing in most classes across the school including working with our specialist teachers.

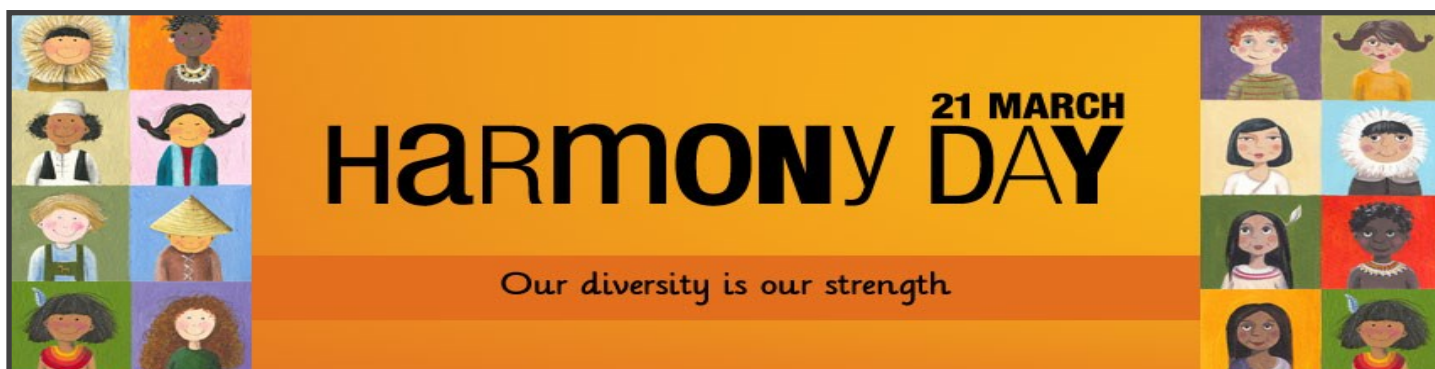
## PRINCIPAL'S NEWS Cont...

From the feedback we have received, the teachers found the visit extremely worthwhile and were very complementary regarding our students and how engaged they are at school. They were particular impressed with the way are school is structured and how teachers in Australian primary schools teach more than one curriculum area. In their primary schools, they have between 45 and 60 students in their classes. They operate on a high school model of having different teachers for Maths, Chinese, Science, English, PE etc.

We also currently have 7 students and a teacher from China staying with host families for 4 weeks on an cultural exchange. I would like to thank the families who have volunteered to welcome these students into their homes and families. The students are really enjoying the experience. The program is funded so they can work with a relief teacher and their teacher every morning until 12 noon and then they spend the remainder of the day in their host class. For the first 2 weeks they will be in year 6/7 classes and then year 5/6 classes for the last 2 weeks. Every Wednesday they have an excursion with their relief and Chinese teachers to experience some of the culture and charm of Adelaide including a visit to Cleland Wildlife Park, the museum and Victor Harbor.

I would like to acknowledge the amazing work of our Assistant Principal, Jodie Cunningham in organising every aspect of this 4 week experience including hosting the teacher at her own home. This has been a tremendous and at times stressful undertaking. Jodie has overcome every obstacle and challenge so this experience could go ahead.

### AVAILABLE METHODS FOR PAYMENTS

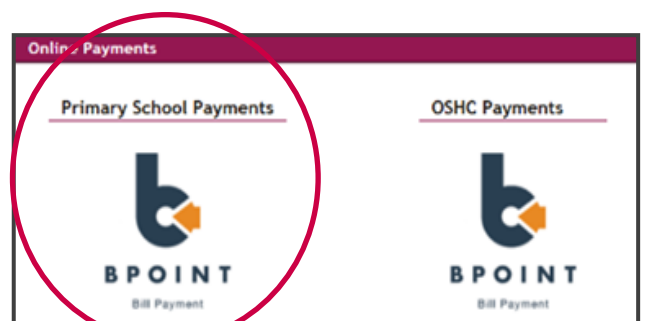

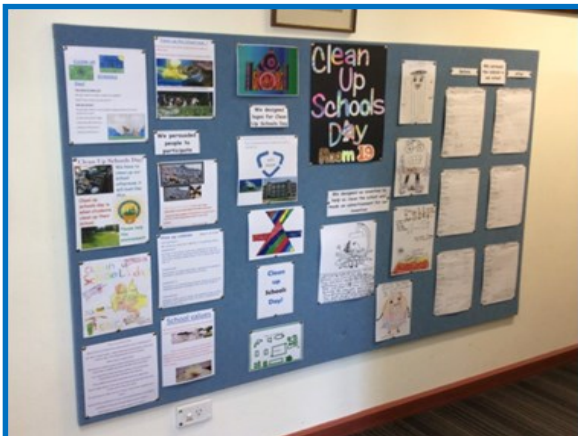


## ROOM 19 NEWS

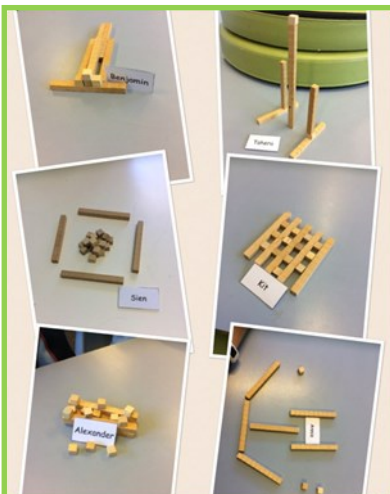
### A SNEAK PEEK AT ROOM 19!

Sometimes there are problems that arise between team members, but we are overcoming these through clear expectations and communication.

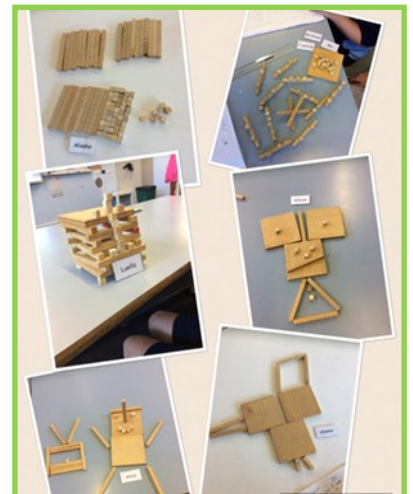


Through the first few weeks of the term, we worked with Rooms 17 and 18 to organise and promote Clean Up Schools Day. This event provided us with an opportunity to integrate different areas of our learning, so that we could see the connection between the classroom and the world around us. Next time you're in the office make sure you have a look at our display of the work put into the Clean Up Schools Day event.



We're getting hands on in maths, creating, changing and playing to build a strong sense of numbers, how they are made and how they can be broken up.

This will lead us into a unit on Money, which is all about preparing for Enterprise Day. By the time it comes around, we'll have plenty of savvy stallholders ready to manage the tills (and give you the right change!)



We are all enjoying Science, where we are finding out about living things, and classifying them based on their features.
