PARENT / TEACHER INTERVIEWS

This week most class teachers are holding interviews with parents and caregivers. Our Reception classes held their interviews in week 7. If you haven't made a time to meet, I would strongly encourage you to do this as the information shared at these conferences is extremely important. I hope that you found the move to online booking much easier and time efficient.

I would like to thank the class teachers for the preparation they put into ensuring the conferences are a quality component of our reporting at CLG. 5 parents randomly selected from each class will receive a feedback sheet we are asking you complete and return to the school. Feedback is an essential part of learning and we are always looking for ways we can improve.

PARENT WORKSHOPS

As you will see from the flier later in the newsletter, on Wednesday May 10th the school is hosting a workshop for parents on Food and the Brain. The workshop will be led by Dr Natalie Parletta. Natalie is the Senior Research Fellow at UniSA and an accredited and practising nutritionist. The workshop has been organised by the school's Education Subcommittee. The presentation includes looking at the importance of micronutrients and omega-3s for brain function, learning and behaviour. Natalie will also elaborate on research and case studies regarding the effects of food chemicals and additives on learning, behaviour and wellbeing. Bookings for this event are limited to the capacity of the staffroom (40). Bookings are made through the school interviews website. See details later in the newsletter or on the school blog.

Later in term 2 we will also be holding a workshop for parents on Dyslexia in the mainstream classroom. This workshop will be presented by SPELD. The tentative date for this workshop is Tuesday June 20th (Week 8). More details will be sent home early in term 2. This parent workshop is supporting the training teachers at CLG will have access to next term on dyslexia.

EASTER CHRISTIAN OPTIONS

After the high level of interest and support in the Christmas Seminars last year, the local ministers involved and I recently met to review how it went and plan ahead. To complete their twice a year involvement at CLG we have also scheduled an Easter Christian Options Program. This will be held next Thursday April 6th for any student receiving permission to attend. The seminar will go for around 45 minutes. A note will be sent home later this week. At the seminar they will learn about and discuss the story of Easter. Students will have the opportunity to ask questions. I would like to emphasise that there is no expectation for your child to attend. It is completely your decision. Students not attending will work on their regular program, although depending on numbers it may be with students in a different class of the same year level.

I would like to thank the 30 or so parents who attended the recent parents and principals forum. We really appreciated your questions and interest. From the questions we received, it has been decided that next term we will focus the forum on intervention and the programs we have at CLG. This will include outlining the programs in place and how students are identified to access support.




CANTEEN NEWS

New to the Canteen are "**FRUITY NUGGETS**" only 60cents available all day only over the counter. They are a bag of cute little pieces of dried fruit (68% Pear) flavoured to either strawberry, apricot or raspberry/blueberry. They have no artificial colours, preservatives or flavours, and no dairy, egg, nut, gluten, soy, sesame or crustacean. They already seem to be a popular choice with the students.

It is pleasing to see that lunch orders have been steadily increasing this term. They have increased from 4.5% in week one to 8.6% last week working on a weekly average and assuming all students being present at school. This is a great improvement and well on the way to our hoped for 15%. Please help us achieve and maintain this goal. **Canteen sales and useage dictate the stock mark up (cost) so the more people use it the cheaper prices can be.**

It is also encouraging and extremely pleasing to note that the healthy choice orders of "make your own" sandwich or wrap with or without fresh vegies or meat have also been increasing in popularity which is great news for healthy children. These are available all the time especially when stocks at home are beginning to dwindle.

It is great to see new volunteers this year, thankyou. There is always room for more helpers. Even when it seems a bit quiet at times these are the moments in which to "teach you the ropes" for the "when we really need you" busy days!! So don't be shy to pop in.
