#### **PROPOSED PERMANENT PARKING RESTRICTION**

I have been contacted and recently met with representatives from the Mitcham Council regarding their proposal to restrict parking to only the eastern side on Winchester Avenue. At the moment, cars can park on both sides of this road, however the council feel it is a safety issue as it is such a narrow street.

Apparently the law states there needs to be 3 metres of road between cars parked on both sides and at times this is not the case. They are concerned about children having to cross the road to get into a car on the western side with such limited space.

Personally, I have not heard or seen of any issues with this street and I expressed my concern to the council that they are making life harder for our parents. I will take this feedback to the next Governing Council meeting and we will provide a response to the Mitcham Council's proposal.

While they were here I spoke at length about issues I believe they should be paying more attention to such as:

- the terrible state of the footpaths around the school, which are a trip hazard
- the work needed to upgrade the Windsor Avenue roads
- attention needed to the sorry state of the lane way which is used as a kiss and drop and
- the overwhelming need for a crossing on West Parkway

Hopefully we may get some action on these issues.

Also, if parents are seeking a sibling right enrolment to an 'out of school zone' application, you must attach a copy of the older sibling's current Student Photo ID to the application. If your child has been accepted to a particular school, please make sure you tick the corresponding box.

## **GOVERNING COUNCIL NEWS**

After establishing a Uniform Committee of 9 parents, proposals were made and taken to the Governing Council of 15 parents last Monday night. After extensive discussion the Governing Council unanimously accepted the recommendations of the Uniform Committee regarding simplifying our school dress code.

#### • The decisions made are: By the end of 2018 the school dress code will <u>no longer</u> include:

- The girl's tartan pinafore
- The girl's tartan skirt
- ° The plain sky blue short sleeve polo top
- ° The plain sky blue long sleeve polo top

#### Reasons for making these changes include:

- The current stock of the pinafore and skirt is limited
- New stock of the pinafore would cost close to \$90.00 to buy which is too expensive
- Wearing the pinafore properly requires adding a blouse which would add more cost
- The pinafore restricts physical activity
- Only a few girls in each class wear the pinafore
- The girls who wear the pinafore are mainly in the younger classes
- The pinafore and skirt are not in the schools colours
- The blue polo tops have been replaced by the current polo tops which include the different panels

Devon Clothing are currently making a new long sleeve polo top that will replicate the look of the current short sleeve top. Hopefully these will be in stock soon.

Although the phasing out of some dress code items doesn't take hold until the end of next year, we have asked Devon to advise parents of this when they are considering buying uniforms. If you have any questions please contact the school.
