PARKING



\$67.5 MILLION FUNDING BOOST TO ACCELERATE STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT

After the Australia wide release of the NAPLAN results, the State Government announced last week they will provide a \$67.5m funding boost to public school students who have been identified as needing more help to lift literacy and numeracy across the state.

Primary school students who are not achieving expected standards or growth will benefit from dedicated intervention funds provided to their school.

Under the 4 year \$67.5m *Literacy and Numeracy First* plan, schools will use extra funds on high-impact teaching strategies to lift student achievement. Schools will use a range of evidence-based teaching strategies, including extra teachers, literacy and numeracy coaches or targeted programs. Improvement strategies will be overseen by a newly-established independent panel of education experts.

The recent NAPLAN results show there has been improvement in numeracy across all year levels in the state, but more work is needed to lift achievement to a higher level for all students in numeracy and in literacy.

The targeted funding – for students in public primary schools – is designed to lift achievement and modernise the state's public education system to prepare young South Australians for jobs of the future.

2017 WATER SAFETY & AWARENESS PROGRAM

It is an exciting time during our Swimming week and here is some information to support families. As part of the DECD swimming and aquatics program this year, CLGPS R - 5 students will be attending swimming over two different weeks. Our year 6/7 students attended aquatics earlier this year.

Younger students will attend Westminster Indoor Pool in week 6 this term whilst older students will attend Unley Outdoor Pool in term 4 week 5. This is a change from last year due to advice from the swimming instructors that older students may find the facilities at Unley Swimming Centre to better suit their needs, as the 'deep end' of Unley pool is deeper than Westminster's pool. With water safety being a key focus of these lessons, the depth of the pool for older students is helpful.

The following classes will be attending Westminster Indoor Pool in term 3 week 6. *Rooms 01, 02, 03, 04, 13, 14, 15, 17, 18, 19, 22, 23 and 24.* A note went home with students last week.

The following classes will attend Unley Outdoor Pool in term 4. **Rooms 11, 12, 20, 21 and the year 5 students from rooms 2, 8 and 9.** Notes will go home later this year.

The program is run by Austswim qualified instructors, with the aim of the program to teach students how to swim effectively with a strong focus on learning water safety, dry rescue, survival and endurance techniques. Students will be travelling by bus to the pool. The cost of the swimming lessons is paid for by the school and the cost of transport is paid for by families.

If your child has asthma, please ensure that any puffers left at school are in date and if your child cares for their own puffer, that they bring that in-date puffer each day they go swimming. If you have any questions about medications, please see Megan in the front office.

Important information about visitors attending swimming is on the back of the swimming note. Please read this if you plan to watch your child at swimming lessons at Westminster Pool.






