### NAPLAN

Last week students in Years 3, 5 and 7 received their results for the annual National Assessment Program Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) tests held in May. As a school we received results in 5 areas for each of the 3 years level tested. The school and staff will be spending time analysing the data we have received down to year level, then class and finally the individual student level. As a school we saw significant improvement in the overall results for year 3 with year 5 and 7 results experiencing a drop in a number of areas. This data is always interesting to analyse as it is comparing 2016 students with 2017 students.

Although these results compare our results with the previous year, they are comparing different groups of students. I find the data below more useful as it tracks the progress of the **same** cohort of students across a 2 year span - it compares 'apples with apples' rather than a different cohort of students in the same year level. Compared to the all students doing the tests across Australia, we are pleasingly over represented in the percentages of students making medium to high growth in the 2 key areas of reading and numeracy. This data shows progress between tests when compared with students of similar ability. Medium growth means that a student is making 2 years growth in these areas over the 2 year period. High growth means more than 2 years growth. If you have any questions about your child's results please contact the school.







# THE ART CORNER


