Please don't feel any pressure, just enjoy the experience. Sometimes simple is best.

Our teacher librarian and library staff have transformed the Library into a treasure trove and have organised some great activities and events. We had our Book Week launch last Friday. The celebrations, activities, performance and author's visit have continued all this week with our wonderful dress up day and parade. I hope the students have enjoyed it as a much as I have.




