



Dear Parents, carers, students and community friends,

SCHOOL CONCERT

Our end of year concert is approaching. I am sure it will be a special experience for all involved. I am excited to announce that this year we have received permission from the Mitcham Council to hold our concert in Mortlock Park. As we have been squeezed for space, I am hoping this change will make viewing much easier and allow room for families to spread out.

Classes have been really busy rehearsing their items for the night. Hopefully this year the weather will be kind. Although we have a bigger space we are still asking families to wait until after lunch playtime finishes to put out rugs and chairs etc. I appreciate your cooperation in this matter.

2019 CLASS STRUCTURES

The class placement process is almost completed. It has taken a lot of time and effort. Classes for 2019 will be announced on Friday of week 8 when placement slips and reports go home. I can advise the school community that we plan on starting with 26 classes. This involves (4) Reception classes, (3) year 1 classes, (1) year 1/2 class, (3) year 2 classes, (2) year 2/3 classes, (2) year 3 classes, (1) year 4 class, (3) year 4/5 classes, (2) year 5 classes, (2) year 6 classes, (2) year 6/7 classes and (1) year 7 class. Where there is a composite class, we have tried to structure it so at least half of the students are in the higher year level.

SCHOOL VALUES SURVEY

As we prepare for the 2019 school year, I am seeking your input into our current school values. As I hope you are aware Colonel Light Gardens we have 3 articulated values of **RESPECT**, **CARE** and **SAFETY**. About 7 or 8 years ago, to determine these values, the school went through a significant process over a 2 year period involving staff, students and the school community.

We believe that having clearly articulated values which we aspire to and live by is essential. We promote and acknowledge these values in our classrooms, assemblies and our day to day interactions.

Since my arrival at CLG in 2016, I have been been discussing with the staff, the Governing Council and other parent groups:

- the relevance of each of the current values
- how understood and embedded they are
- · if they encompass all aspects of the CLG schooling experience
- · if any of the values need to be adjusted or changed.

After surveying members of the Governing Council, the staff and students this year, the majority felt that the values of **RESPECT** and **CARE** are relevant and appropriate, however we are seeking your input into:

- the relevance of the third value SAFETY or if it should be changed to RESPONSIBILITY
- if we need to add a fourth value highlighting the importance of the **learning** and/or **achievement** focus we have at CLG.

BYOD - PARENT INFORMATION SESSION



We invite the parents of all students moving into Year's 6 & 7 classes next year to come and join us for a Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) information session.

The aim of the BYOD program at Colonel Light Gardens Primary school is to provide 1-to-1 access to technology to support student learning. We believe that through the use of digital technologies we equip students to participate in a rapidly changing world where communication, collaboration and inquiry are increasingly transformed by technology.

The benefits of a Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) program in upper primary are:

- increased student participation due to better access to technology
- increased student driven learning, students have more control over their learning
- better student organisation with easy access to email, calendar and reminders
- personalised learning; students can choose which applications they use to complete investigations and thinking and are able to store all their work on one device, giving them access to their learning anytime and anywhere
- increased student responsibility, in caring for the device
- a better connection with home and school

Please come along to the information session to learn more about supporting your child with this device and to ask any questions that you may have about the program. For those parents who cannot make it we will send home information about the program in the next newsletter.
